

Transnational Threats and Counterterrorism Specialist- Sr. level

Traveling requirement: 25%

DUTIES:

- Support two programs on Countering Violent Extremism and ancillary support to three other programs with syllabus development and to provide support.
- Develop syllabus framework, background, lesson objectives, syllabus entries, and reading lists for multiple sessions: Domestic Security and the Rule of Law and Transnational Crime and Terrorism.
- Review remaining AA syllabus to identify and minimize substantive content gaps.
- Develop, identify and finalize a program schedule and potential speakers ensuring comprehensiveness of draft syllabus, identifying and confirming facilitators and speakers for the program and developing speaker talking points.
- Serve as the faculty lead for execution of programs with the responsibility of preparing and conducting facilitator orientation, facilitating discussion groups, working with report writer to produce program highlights/report and policy paper.
- Oversees close-out of programs including producing a short report on key lessons learned, overseeing production of After Action Reviews, and thank you letters.
- Serve as facilitator, speaker for the program, support other ACSS faculty in the development and execution of FY11 programs and deliver lectures for Africa Center events and programs.
- Conduct subject matter research, interview and interact with a wide range of experts and practitioners, contribute to and draw from professional discussions, develop readings, course material, syllabi and other products for use with ACSS course participants.

REQUIRED SKILLS:

- Demonstrated skill and experience developing and implementing programs and curricula.
- Strong research and writing skills.
- Availability and ability to travel to Africa.
- Advanced French and Portuguese language skills (spoken and written) required.

REQUIRED EXPERIENCE:

- Professional background and experience in African security issues, preferably with both field experience to work transnational security and CT issues, especially as they relate to Africa, and US-Africa relations.

REQUIRED EDUCATION: Doctorate or advanced graduate degree status preferred. An advanced degree in a related field required (e.g., African studies, political science, international relations or security studies and work performed in Africa.
